UPDATE ON HAITI RECOVERY

The South Florida Haiti Project is pleased to report that to date it has received \$60,000 in Haiti Relief. This response from the partners of SFHP has been incredible. Thank you for your open generosity. Of that \$23,602 has been spent for immediate general support for Pere Kesner's discretion, security for the Friendship House, the Goat Farm, internet startup system, new latrines, added feeding, and clearing land for a temporary church tent.

The Executive Committee has decided to use \$25,000 from funds received to date for a new vehicle for Ste. Marie Madeleine Parish and School. SFHP will request a matching grant from Episcopal Charities to complete the necessary funds of \$50,000 for this much needed vehicle.
