TASTE OF INDIA POT LUCK

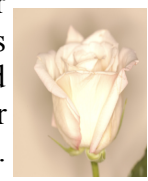
Sunday, May 30, 5 PM, Harris Hall

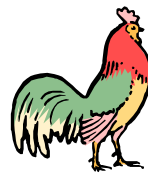
